

# EMPLOYEES CLEAN GREEN SPACES



In a celebration of their first 100 years, approximately 200 Briggs & Stratton employees and their families participated in a cleanup/improvement effort at McCarty Park in West Allis on Saturday, May 17, 2008.

In addition to employees donating their time cleaning the park, Briggs & Stratton also donated two new Ferris ZTR model IS 5100 Z mowers, valued together at \$40,000. New aluminum bleachers, dugouts and players benches for the baseball field inside McCarty Park were purchased with money donated by Briggs & Stratton.

At the kickoff of the event, Milwaukee County Parks Director Sue Black presented a proclamation to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of Briggs & Stratton. The proclamation will be prominently displayed at the Corporate Office Building.
